In Pennsylvania, licensed wildlife rehabilitators and volunteers must have RVS certification to handle "rabies vector species" or RVS. To obtain RVS certification, it is required for rehabilitators and volunteers to attend RVS training in addition to obtaining pre-exposure rabies vaccines or have a protective rabies titer.
