What is Centre Wildlife Care? Centre Wildlife Care (CWC) is a 501c3, non-profit organization dedicated to caring for injured, orphaned, sick and displaced wildlife for the purpose of releasing them back into the wild. CWC also provides educational programs about wildlife to the public.

Who is CWC? CWC is run by a team of local volunteers and is funded solely by donations. The director, Robyn Graboski, is a trained and Licensed Wildlife Rehabilitator who has been rehabilitating wildlife since 1988. Robyn is licensed by the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Fish and Boat Commission and the Federal Fish and Wildlife Service to possess and care for compromised wild animals.
